

## WELCOME TO TUZLA



Tuzla is the economic, cultural, educational, health and tourist centre of northeast Bosnia. It is an educational center and is home to two universities. It is also the main industrial machine and one of the leading economic strongholds of the country with a wide and varied industrial sector including an expanding service sector thanks to its salt lake tourism.

In Bosnia and Herzegovina, Tuzla is also regarded as one of the most multicultural cities in the country and has managed to keep the pluralist character of the city throughout the Bosnian War and after, with Bosniaks, Serbs, Croats and a small minority of Bosnian Jews residing in Tuzla.



Since the importance of salt and its natural resources was the main goal and particular focus of Tuzla, in 1885 was built the first Salt Factory and therefore marked the beginning of the induftrial salt production in Tuzla.

## **About Tuzla**

Tuzla is the third-largeft city of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the administrative center of Tuzla Canton.

As a town whose date goes back to the year 950, the times of Byzantine Emperor, covers 303 km<sup>2</sup> area and is settled underneath the Majevica mountain that's placed in the central part of North-Eaftern Bosnia.

## History

Besides the fact that Tuzla has always been closely tied to its salt resources and is known as one of the most sustainable industrial regions, it is considered to be the third largest city of Bosnia and Herzegovina with continuity of living in this area. Tuzla itself has an interes ting geological history. It is known as "the city of the grain" which is left from the Pannonian Sea and retreated from more than ten million years ago. Its name has been related by numerous travelers, writers and historians to salt, starting from the Greeks by the name Castron de Salenes and Salenes, Ad Solinas (Latin), Soli (South Slavic) all the way to Tuz, which is Turkish and means saline.





## **UNIVERSITY OF TUZLA**

## About University of Tuzla

The first higher education institution in Tuzla was founded in 1958, when, at the request of the mines of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Higher Mining and Technical School was founded. The first generation enrolled 158 students. The Higher School of Mining grew into the Faculty of Mining in 1960. In the same year, the Higher Pedagogical School began its work, enrolling 71 full-time and 236 part-time students in the first generation. The Pedagogical Academy was established in 1970 as an outgrowth of the Higher Pedagogical School.



Ismet Mujezinovič

The establishment of new faculties created the prerequisites for the eftablishment of the University. By the decision of the Tuzla Municipality Assembly from April 15, 1975, the Initiative Committee for the establishment of the University was appointed with 104 members and the president, academician Ismet Mujezinovič. The agreement on joining the University was signed on November 18, 1976 in Sarajevo, and the opening ceremony was held on December 18 in Tuzla.

The Faculty of Electrical Engineering in Tuzla began its work in 1976. The founding of the Faculty of Medicine in Tuzla and the Faculty of Economics in Brčko, in 1976, represented a crossroad from which the field of multidisciplinarity was entered, gradually moving away from a predominantly technical profile.

Everything that has been achieved so far has brought us closer to the model of a well-organized European university, which is capable of sustaining itself in any transformation of higher education in Bosnia and Herzegovina due to its quality. Today, the University of Tuzla is an institution without which it would be impossible to imagine not only the city of Tuzla, but also the entire region.

At the University of Tuzla, the academic year is divided into two semesters. The grading system includes a scale from 5 to 10, as shown above. This grading system is used at all univeristies in Bosnia and Herzegovina and it is used for exchange students as well.









## Study programs

Generally lectures are given in the Bos/Croat/Serb language. except for Foreign Languages Departments (English, German and Turkish, where the language of instrucon is English, German and Turkish, respecvely). However for exchange students it is possible to organize classes in English regarding their work, research, exams, paper work, etc.

- Nomination letter from your home University, indicating your nomination

## **DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED**

- Preliminary Learning Agreement (approved by your home University)
  - Transcript of Records
  - Student Scholarship Agreement
- Language Cerficate (English, Bosnian/Croatian/Serbian, German, Turkish), depending on the program you are applying for
  - CV

## **BEFORE YOU ARIVE**

Contact the Internaonal Relations Office, You are nominated! Congrats! Please contact the Internaonal Relations Office of the University of Tuzla. Your applicaon will be forwarded to the corresponding Faculty. You receive a confirmation email/Leter of Acceptance and all information about documentaon (in case you need to send addional documents or make any changes) deadlines for arrival, accommodaon information, documentaon for residence permit, etc.

## **DOCUMENTS**

It is important to bring all documents signed and stamped by your home University. Make sure to bring 3 copies of signed documents to be signed by our University. Changes can only be made after your arrival upon a request of the student. Please note that all changes need to be approved by your home University and by the Dean of the corresponding Faculty at the University of Tuzla.

## RESIDENCE PERMIT

Students who will stay longer than 90 days will need to apply for a residence permit. This document is issued by the Service for Foreigners' Affairs.

- Request for approval/renewal of Temporary Resident Permit
- Cerficate of enrolment at the University of Tuzla
- Scholarship contract
- Two photos, size 35x 45 mm
- Two verified copies of your passport (the page with personal data and the page with the stamp of entry in Bosnia and Herzegovina)
  - Residence permit confirmation/ White Card
  - · Evidence confirming your good financial standing
  - Proof of secured accommodaon
  - · Valid health insurance
  - Medical Report done in Tuzla Canton (upon arrival)
  - Evidence of no criminal records
  - Administrave fee ( app. 150 KM )



## APPLICATION PROCEDURE



## ARRIVAL

Upon arrival in to Bosnia and Herzegovina, you are required to register your residence within 48 hours from the moment of entry in B&H in a field office of the Service for Foreigners' Affairs. First, you need to regulate your Cerficate of permit registraon White Card. At this moment you need to submit: verified copies of your passport, a proof of secured accommodaon (contract and a copy of the landlord's ID card) You will have 15 days to collect all other documents, fill out the request for approval/renewal of Temporary Resident Permit. Make sure that the document is printed on both sides, and don't forget to sign the request. The request needs to be filled out in Bosnian/Croatian/Serbian Language. You can contact the Office for Internaonal Relations or the Erasmus Student Network for any assistance you might need.




## MEDICAL CHECK

This needs to be done in Tuzla at Dom Zdravlja (Health Center). We recommend you to go in groups with one student that speaks Bosnian/Croatian/Serbian Language. This will cost you about 60 Euros (120 KM). The Cerficate of Enrolment will be issued by the Internaonal Relations Office. The Scholarship contract has to be translated by an official Court Interpreter. The Health Insurance has to be valid in Bosnia and Herzegovina and translated in Bosnian/Croatian/Serbian Language by an official Court Interpreter. Please check at the Service for Foreigners' Affairs if your Health Insurance is valid in Bosnia and Herzegovina. The Evidence of no criminal records has to be translated by an official Court Interpreter as well.







It was built in 1961 with an initial capacity of approximately 279 beds. At that time, a modern student cafeteria with a capacity of 2000 meals per day was also constructed within Pavilion I.

The accommodation capacity of this dormitory was reduced when a part of its rooms was refurbished and made available to the Faculty of Law upon its establishment in Tuzla.

Today, Pavilion I offers accommodation for 236 students. The rooms are well-furnished, equipped with necessary furniture. Students have unlimited Wi-Fi access.

Bathrooms are shared but separate for female and male students. Within the pavilion, there is a central laundry room for students to wash, dry, and iron their bedding, as well as offices for staff and s tudent organizations such as the University of Tuzla Student Association "SPUT" and the "STUDENJAK" student association.

Pavilion I also hosts a central student cafeteria, where ftudents from all three Pavilions are served. Lunch and dinner are provided to students based on subsidies from the cantons they come from and their monthly payments. Each student is entitled to 30 lunches and 20 dinners per month.

Pavilion I is equipped with classrooms where students can study and prepare for classes and exams at the university



## ACCOMMODATION INFORMATION



This dormitory has a capacity of 119 beds and is exclusively for female students. The rooms are single, double, and triple occupancy. It includes a TV lounge and a classroom. Like the other two dorms, students have free internet access, and there are shared bathrooms on each floor. Additionally, there are kitchenettes equipped with electric stoves, refrigerators, and sinks on each floor. Hot water is available around the clock, both in summer and winter, without interruptions.

The dorm is also heated centrally during the winter.



This dormitory has a capacity of 180 beds and offers modern amenities. Each room has its own bathroom and toilet. Rooms are double and triple occupancy, and on the third floor, each room has its own balcony. The dormitory also provides a recently renovated classroom and plans to acquire modern fitness equipment for a fitness room.

Students have unlimited internet access, and hot water is available throughout the day, both in summer and winter. On each floor, there is a kitchenette where students can prepare coffee or tea for themselves or quests.

In addition to the above, the dormitory has separate prayer rooms for both male and female students to accommodate religious practices throughout the year, including the holy month of Ramadan.

## The Pannonian Lakes

Pannonian lakes are artificial salt lakes in Tuzla. The complex consifts of three lakes of different sizes and depths, and salty waterfalls. As part of the Pannonian Lakes complex, there is also the Neolithic settlement of Sojenica, sports fields and many other catering, cultural and entertainment facilities. All three lakes are located in the very center of Tuzla. The Pannonian lakes are unique examples of salt lakes in Europe, and they have healing properties thanks to the content of salt and other minerals.

## Meša and Ismet Statue

Meša Selimović and Ismet Mujezinović are the most famous people from Tuzla. The sculptures were designed by the Croatian sculptor Marija Ujević Galetović (1933), known for her interesting figures placed in an unconventional way in public space. It is not only about an excellent sculptural work, but about a life composition that, with its emphatically human note, represents a suggestive place for meetings.



## Gazi Turali-begova Mosque (Turali-Bey)

Turali-beg's mosque is located in the very center of Tuzla. It was built in 1572 with funds from one of the founders of modern urban Tuzla, Gazi Turali-bey. It has been renovated and adapted several times, and the adaptation from 1878 is particularly interesting. The last adaptation was in 1967. The reopening of the restored Turali Bey Mosque took place on September 14, 2014.





## The Square of Freedom

Tuzla completed its rich tourist offer with the opening of the reconstructed Freedom Square. It is the tenth square in the area of Tuzla municipality. Freedom Square is the largest square in Bosnia and Herzegovina, where there is a reconstructed Baroque building from the Austro-Hungarian period.



An archaeological site with very significant remains of archaeological material was discovered on the Square. The space is arranged for socializing and various events, and it is decorated with a central fountain with accompanying facilities. The central place on the Square is occupied by a large fountain, the outer walls of which are decorated with stečaks. However, these are not the only symbols of medieval Bosnia on Freedom Square.

Tušanj City Stadium

Tušanj Stadium is a multifunctional stadium in Tuzla. Currently, it is mostly used for playing football matchesans and it is the home stadium of FK Sloboda Tuzla. The stadium has a capacity of 15,000 spectators and is named after the part of the city where it is located. The stadium has floodlights that were built in 1979.



## Peace Flame House

Association Peace Flame House organizes and performs activities in the facility Peace Flame House. "Fred foundation" from the Netherlands ftarted the project in 1994 with philanthropic ideas and with assiftance of sportsmen who took part in Winter Olympic Games in 1984 in Sarajevo, local community and many people of good will. This unique facility – Peace Flame House in Tuzla- is a great contribution to repatriation and development of culture in Bosnia and Herzegovina. In 2003 the Peace Flame House was conftructed. Today the House is the home for associations which work and bring a message of peace and tolerance and which tend to widen the awareness of citizens about social needs through various workshops about social values, culture of living and education

## Cathedral of the Dormition of the Mother of God

The Church of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, in the municipality of Tuzla, belongs to the Serbian Orthodox Church. The cathedral was built for eight years, from 1874 to 1882. The Commission for the Preservation of National Monuments, at the session held from July 3 to 9, 2007, made a decision to declare the church a national monument of Bosnia and Herzegovina.



## Central Park Tuzla

Tuzla is the city with the largeft park areas in Bosnia and Herzegovina. The central city park is located in the pedeftrian zone of the historic center of Tuzla. Visitors Monuments inspired by the Bosnian Middle Ages have been inftalled in the City Park, and the ftatue of the firft Bosnian king, Tvrtko I Kotromanič, occupies the central place. A ftone obelisk was also erected, on which the text of the Charter of Kulina Ban was written. The bridge provides a high-quality pedeftrian connection between the Central City Park and the Pannonian Lakes complex



## PLACES TO VISIT

## International Atelier "Ismet Mujezinović"

International Atelier "Ismet Mujezinovic" is unique because one of the most significant artists, cultural workers and painters of Bosnia and Herzegovina lived and worked there. His family members granted his house and his atelier to the City. Atelier "Ismet Mujezinovic" is a separate art workshop within the Gallery, which gathers artists from all over the world on the basis of an invitation of Art Council of the Gallery and on the principle of a public invitation through national art associations. This is the place where one organizes concerts, exhibitions, promotions of books, and the garden of the Atelier in the downtown is a place adequate for organization of many other events.





## Salty Spa Complex

Pannonia Lakes Complex is adjacent to Salty Spa Complex for sposrts and relaxation, which is one of the wideft and the best decorated central parks in Bosnia. Besides walking and jogging paths, this park includes tennis courts, a basketball court and a five-a-side football field and some memorials from the newest history of the City. In this park there are memorials to heroes and victims of the Second World War, to Patriotic Defence 1992- 1995 War veterans and civil victims of the war and to the youth of Tuzla who lost their lives on the Gate in 1995.

## **Zoo Bingo**

Zoo Bingo is located next to Tuzla, 800 meters from Tuzla-Sarajevo highway.
