Dr. Ayşe İlayda Mutlu is a highly accomplished Speech and Language Therapist and Special Education Specialist

- She completed her undergraduate studies in 2011 at Gazi University, Department of Special Education, followed by her master's degree in the Speech Disorders Department at Gazi University in 2012.
- During her master's studies, she focused on individuals who stutter and conducted a validity and reliability study for the Turkish adaptation of the widely used Stuttering Severity Instrument 4 (SSI-4), which earned her the title of specialist.
- In 2021, Dr. Mutlu obtained her doctorate from Hacettepe University's Speech and Language Therapy program, where she conducted research on the validity and reliability of the Test of Childhood Stuttering severity test.
- In addition to her expertise in Speech and Language Therapy and Special Education, Dr. Mutlu also provides support to individuals with speech and language therapy needs. She has extensive experience working with individuals on the autism spectrum and those with language delays, participating in various training sessions to enhance her skills and provide more effective education and assistance.
- Dr. Mutlu has made significant contributions to her field, particularly in the assessment and treatment of stuttering. She played a key role in adapting internationally used stuttering assessment tools into Turkish and has conducted valuable research on childhood speech sound disorders, including articulation disorders, phonological disorders, and childhood apraxia of speech.
- Currently, Dr. Mutlu serves as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Speech and Language Therapy at Lokman Hekim University in Turkey. She is also a member of the Turkish Stuttering Association and has published several research articles in the field of speech and language disorders.
